



### Professor Louis Hoffmann's 4 Pip's Puzzle

In 1893, Professor Louis Hoffmann published the first challenge in his classic collection, Puzzles Old & New. His original drawings are shown below.













Today the modern cards would look like the ones shown below.









**Challenge 1**: You have four simple cards, all are fives. His challenge was to arrange the 4 cards, face upward on the desk, so that card shows only **four** of their pips.

Two additional challenges have been made in more modern to expand on the original puzzle

#### Challenge 2:


Arrange the 4 cards, face upward on the desk, so that each card shows only **three of their pips**. Assemble the cards so that to get each of them to show only three of their pips.

### Challenge 3

Arrange the 4 cards, face upward on the desk, so that one card shows only **one of their pips**, a second card shows only **two of their pips**, a third card shows only **three of their pips** and the last card shows only **four of their pips**.
